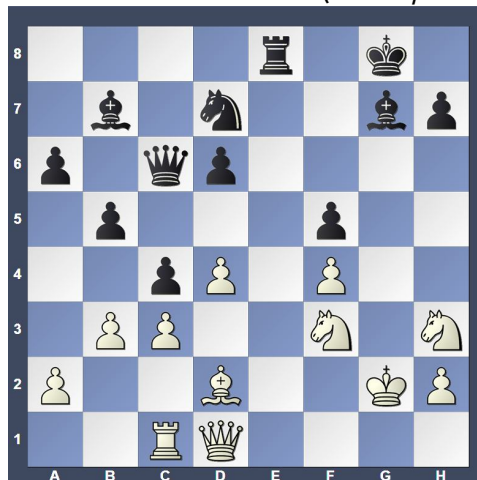

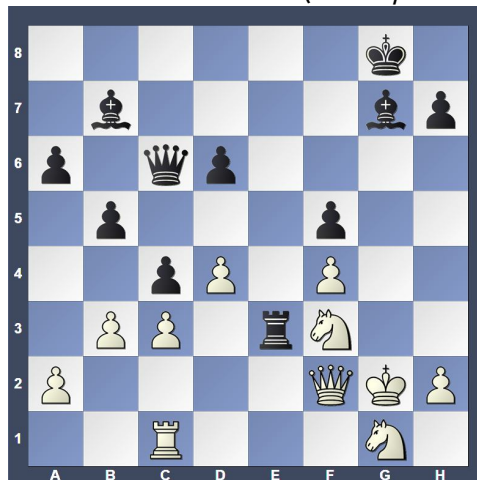

Position after 23.Nh3? (From prev. column)



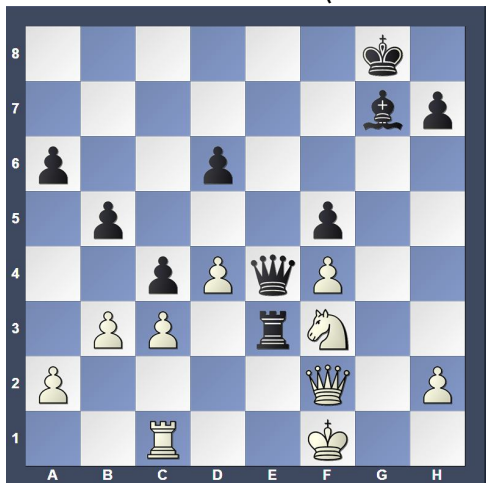

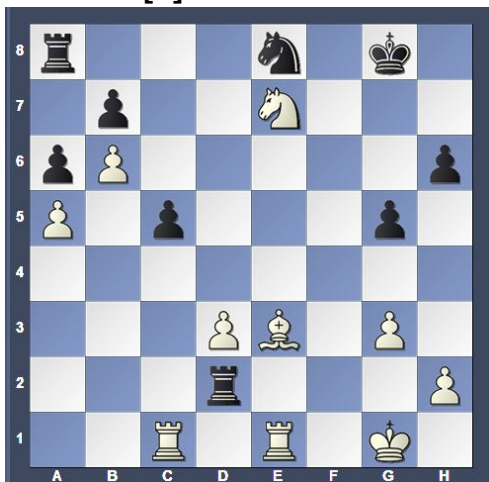
